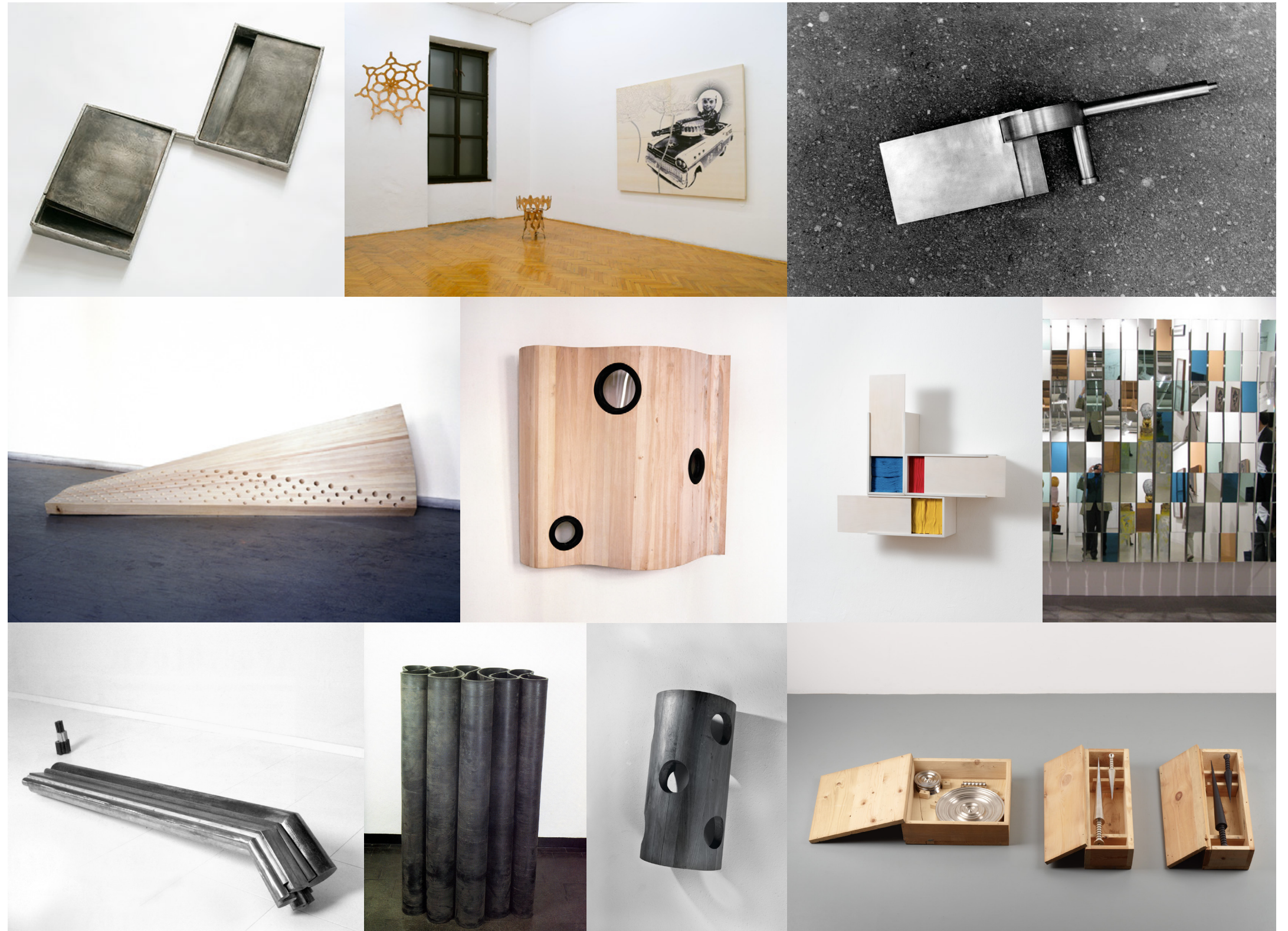
Srđan Apostolović

1987 - enrolled in postgraduate studies in the class of Miodrag Popović

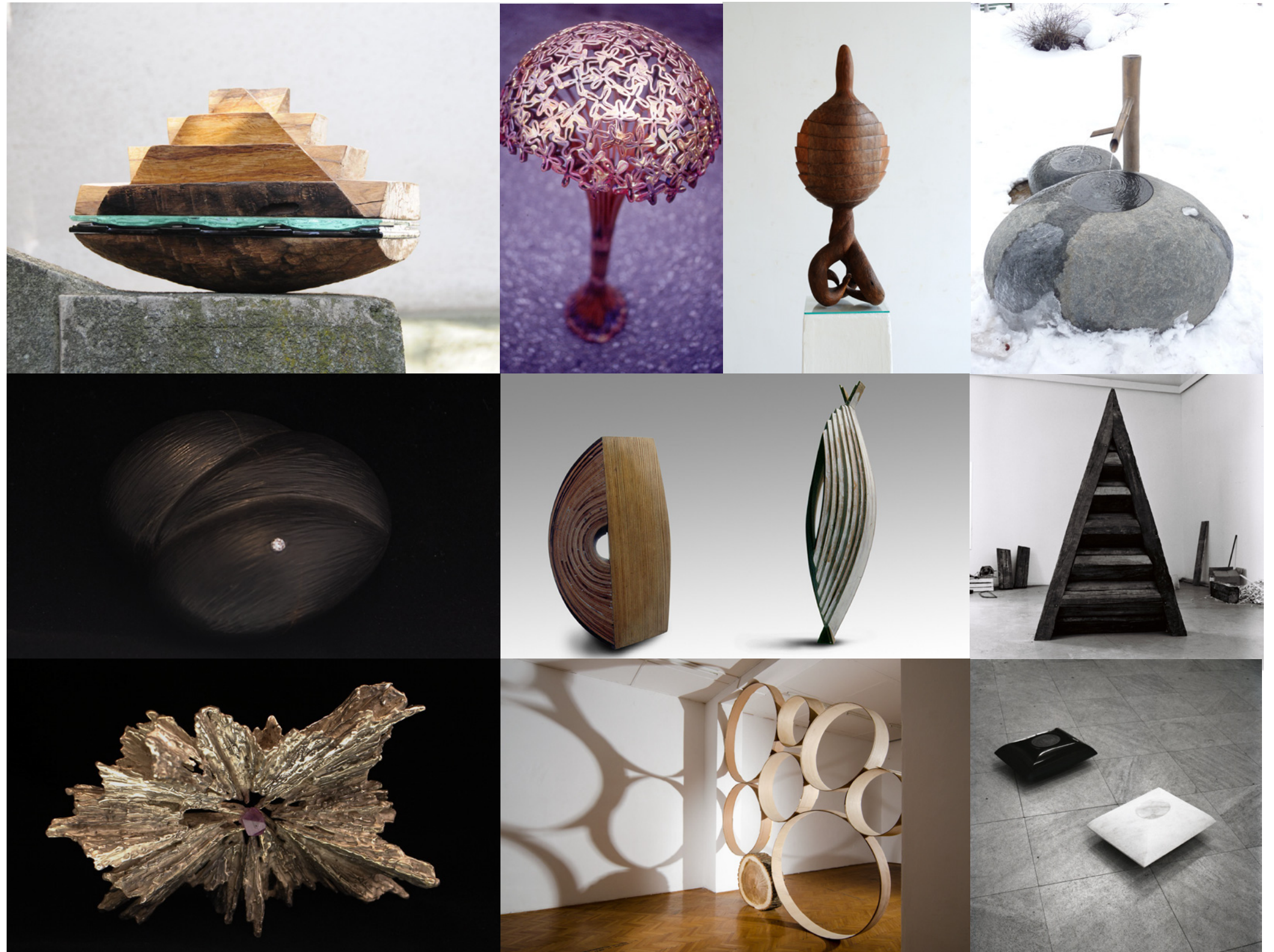
1988 - became a member of the Association of Fine Artists of Serbia

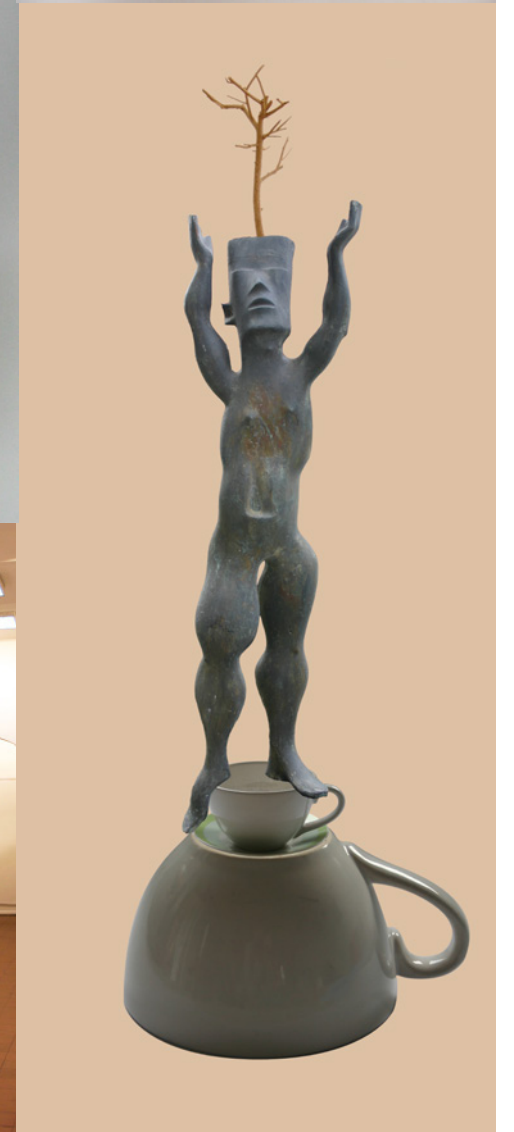
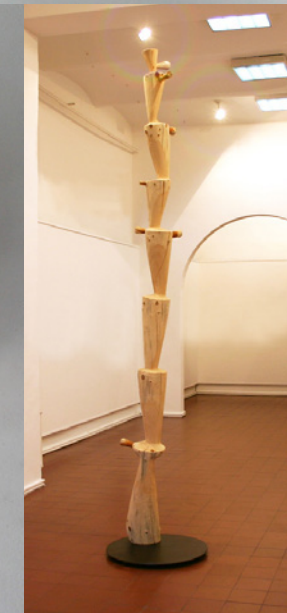
Zdravko Joksimović
